OVERVIEW



More than 140 candidates have joined the Courage Candidate coalition. Founded by Citizens' Impeachment in November, 2025, these congressional candidates hail from 37 states, and cover more than 100 House districts. After speaking with many congressional staffers to advocate for impeachment, Citizens' Impeachment decided that since Congress was not keen on upholding their oath of office, they would seek out the candidates who would. The official Courage Candidate platform is a full-slate of pro-democracy positions: pro-impeachment, anti-corruption, anti-oligarchy, and anti-authoritarian. In February, 2026, the candidates voted to also adopt anti-ICE.

The positions in this document are the result of their votes on more than 100 policy issues. As illustrated, the Candidates align on all issues with at least an 85% majority. The issues where they align in full include the following:

Courage Candidates are here to change how we do politics in America. They are united for democracy, and already aligned on a vast array of issues ahead of taking their oath of office. Once in Congress, they will form the basis of a new political bloc: the Courage Caucus. Driven by an anti-authoritarian ideology that includes the people in their theory of power, they are actively engaging in the discussion of what it means to have a Responsive Government: a commitment to Town Halls, open office hours, a constituent portal that transparently displays the number of emails and phone call a member receives, and a feedback system to give opinions on upcoming bills. They do not accept the status quo and are ready to change it, together.

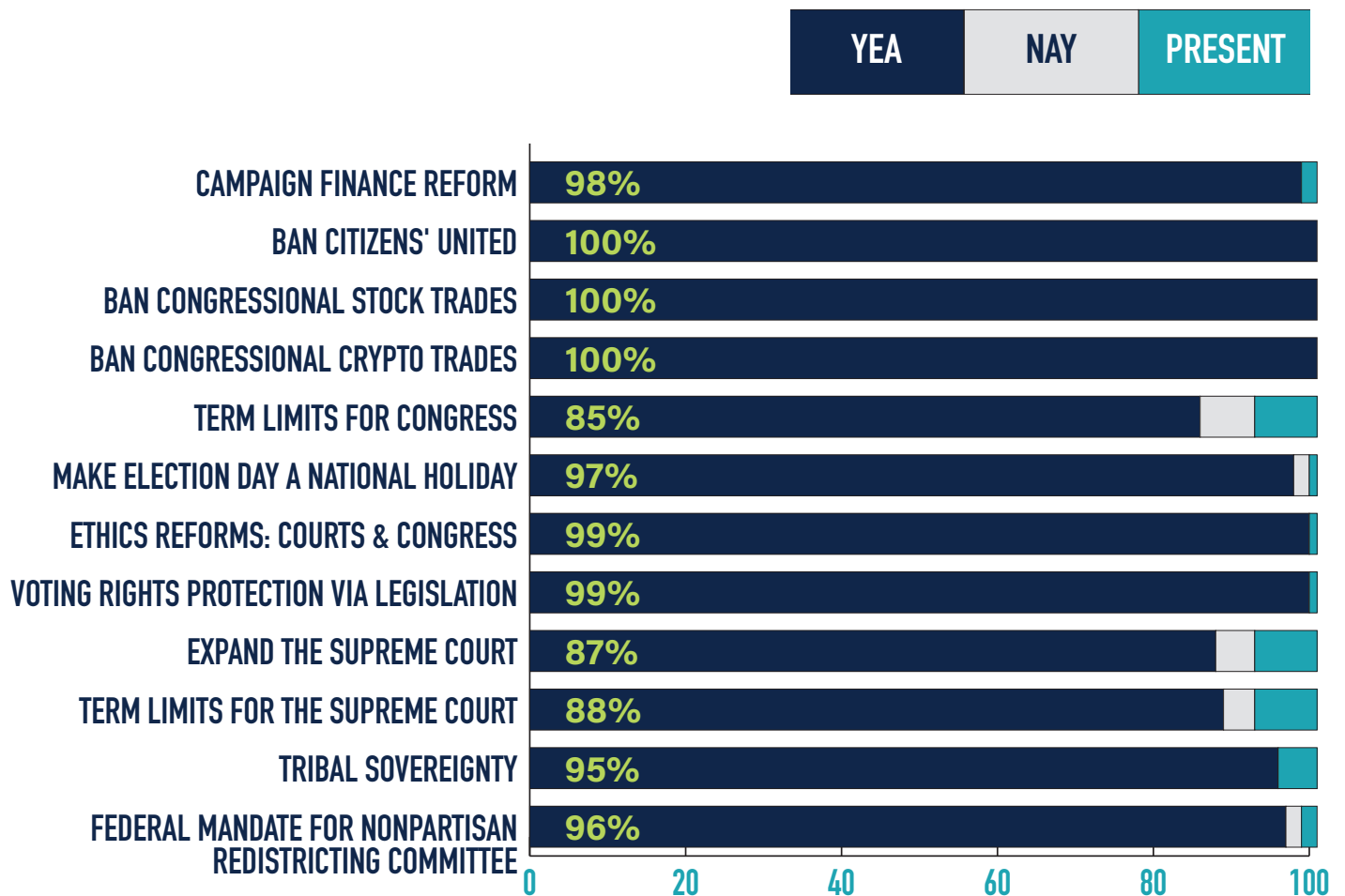
Courage Candidate Statements

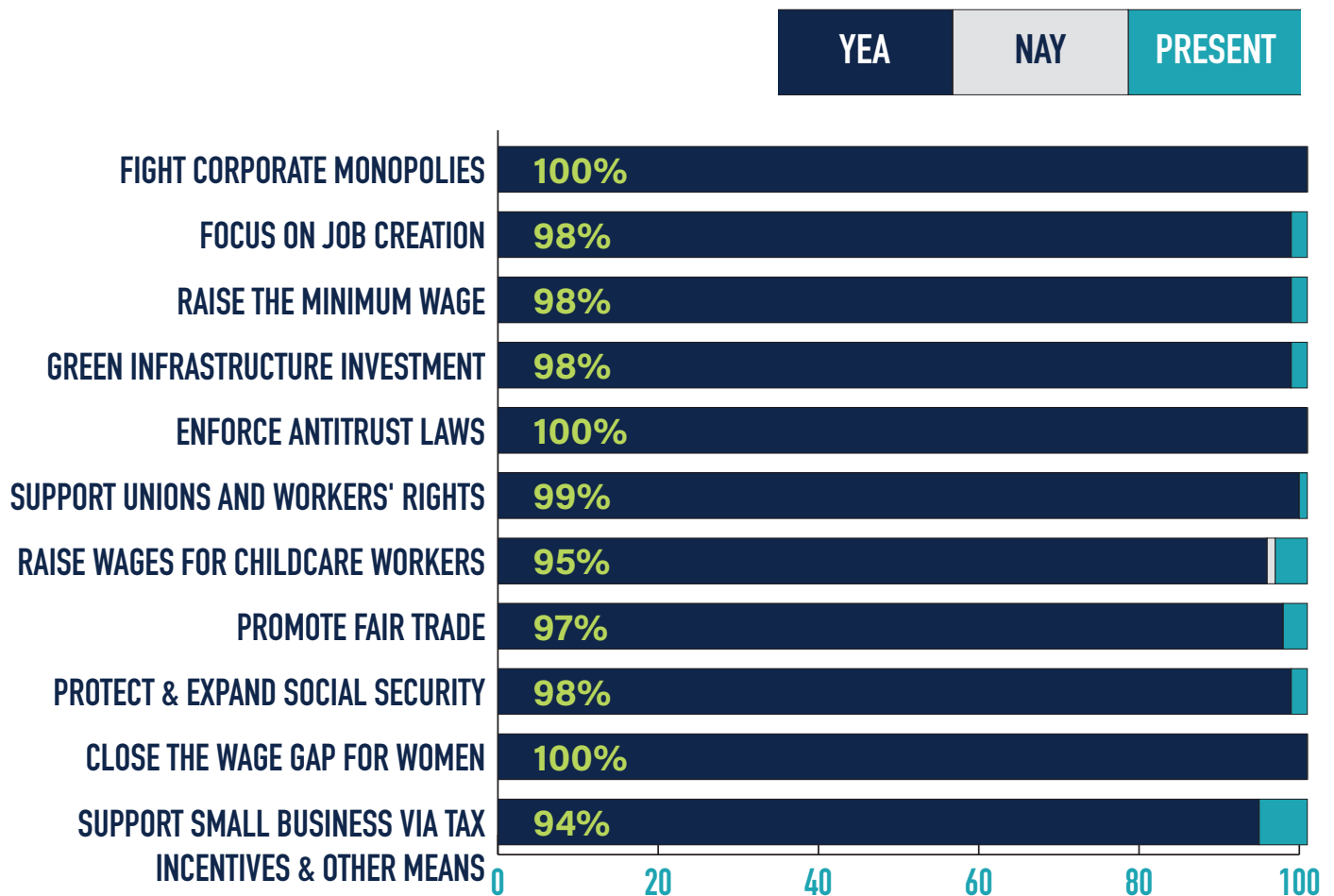
“Fairness and equity for small business.” –California

EDUCATION

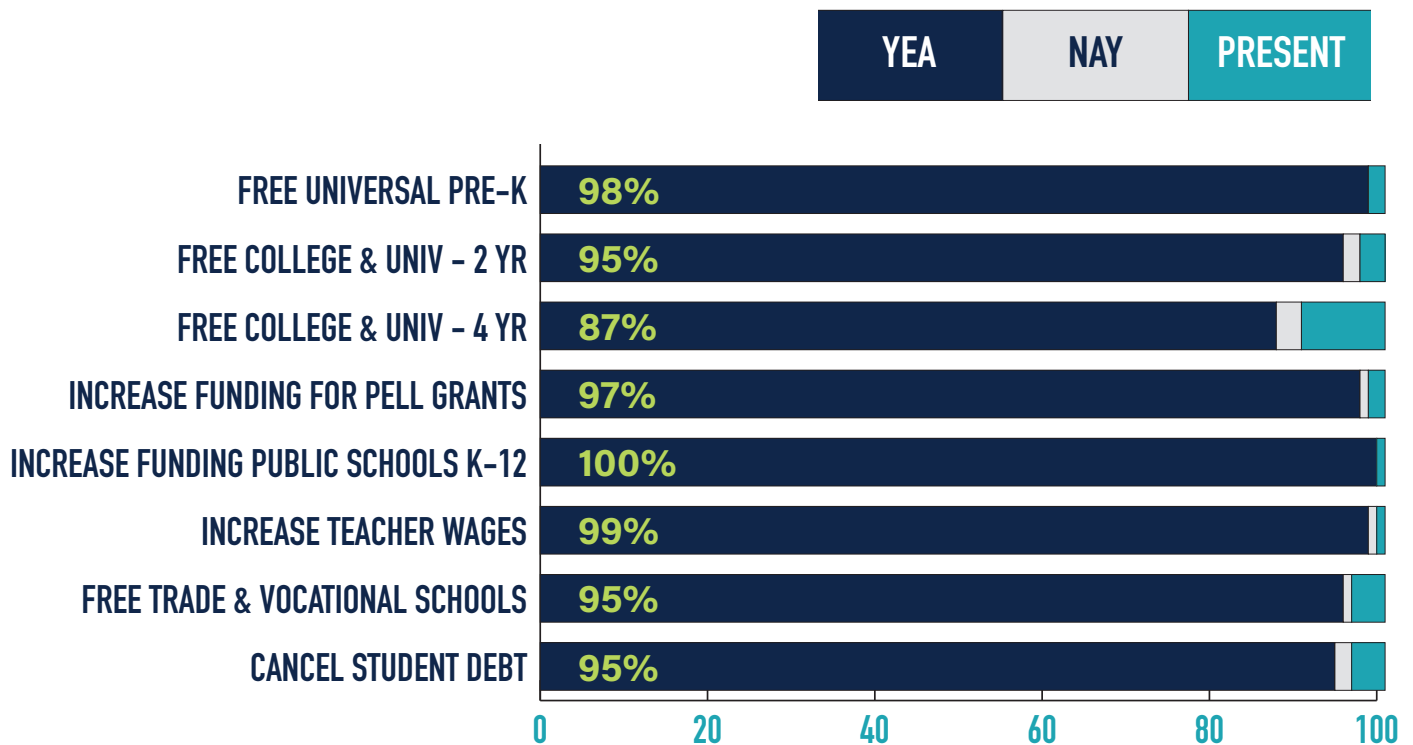


Courage Candidate Statements

“I will advocate for fully funding public schools, restoring and strengthening the Department of Education, and ensuring equitable resources regardless of zip code. That includes opposing efforts that divert funding from neighborhood schools and undermine democratic accountability, such as school choice vouchers.” –Illinois

“I believe strong public education is the most important part of our society. While I believe higher education and Pre-K must be made more accessible, I’m wary of pushing for it to be ‘free.’ We need to ensure we set up structures that can help pay for themselves and drive innovation and competition on a global scale.” –Texas

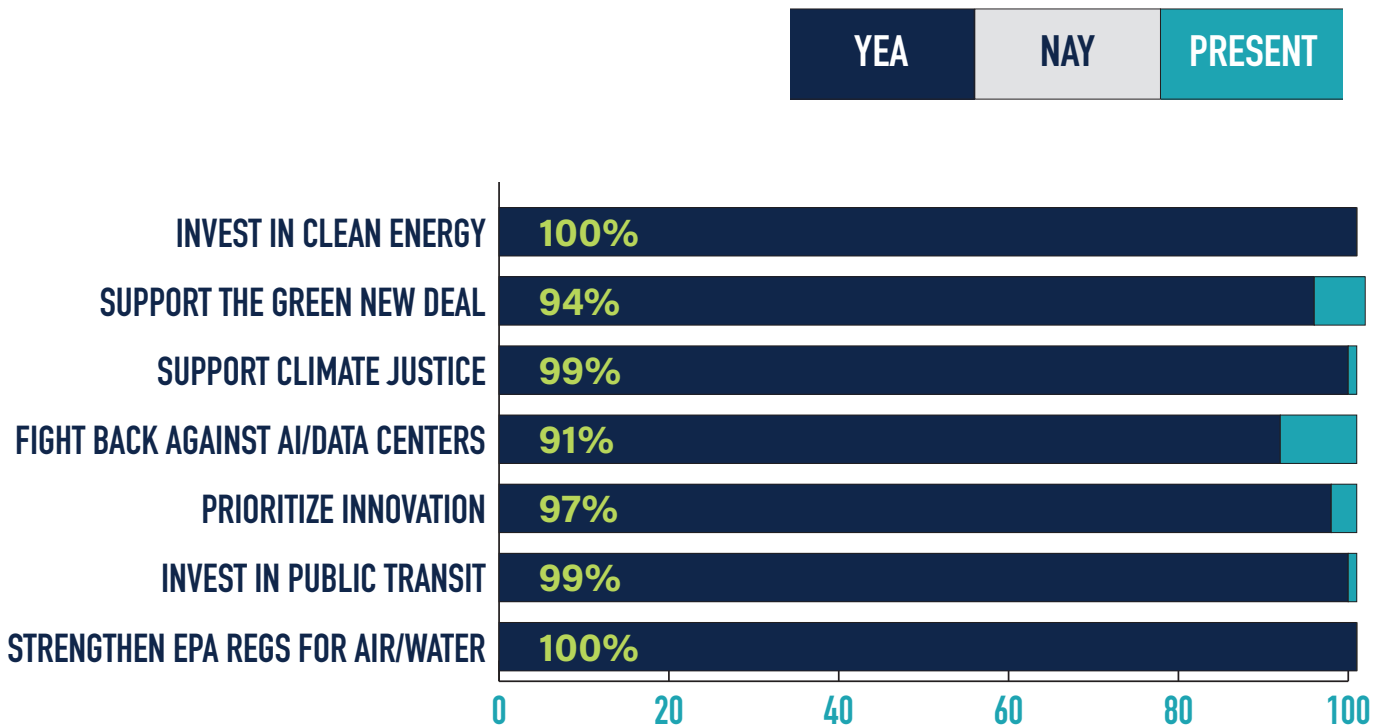


Courage Candidate Statements

FAMILIES



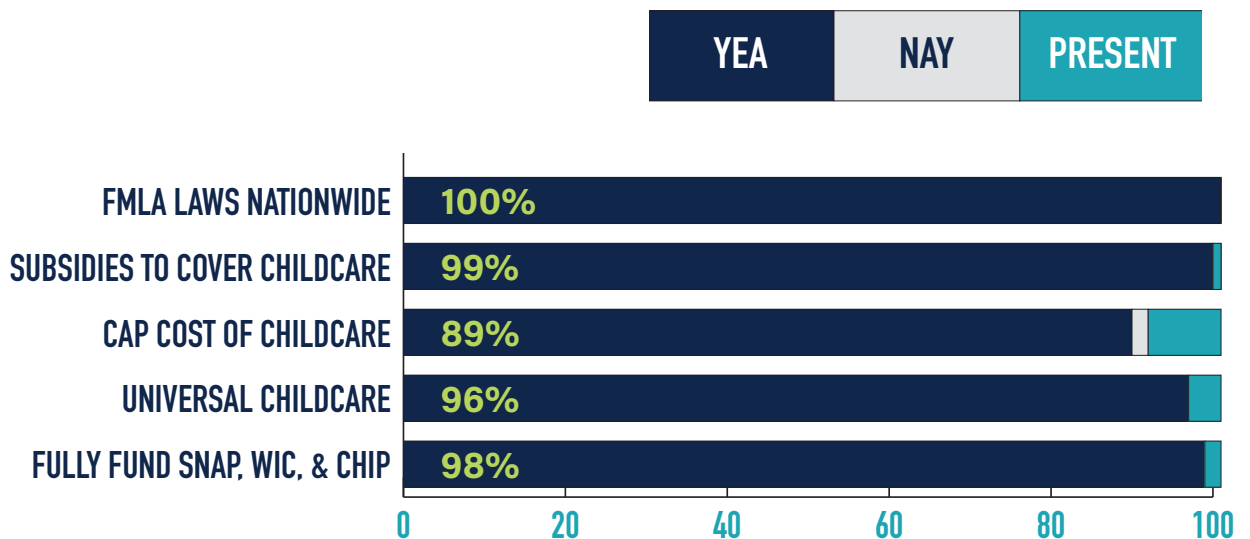
Courage Candidate Statements

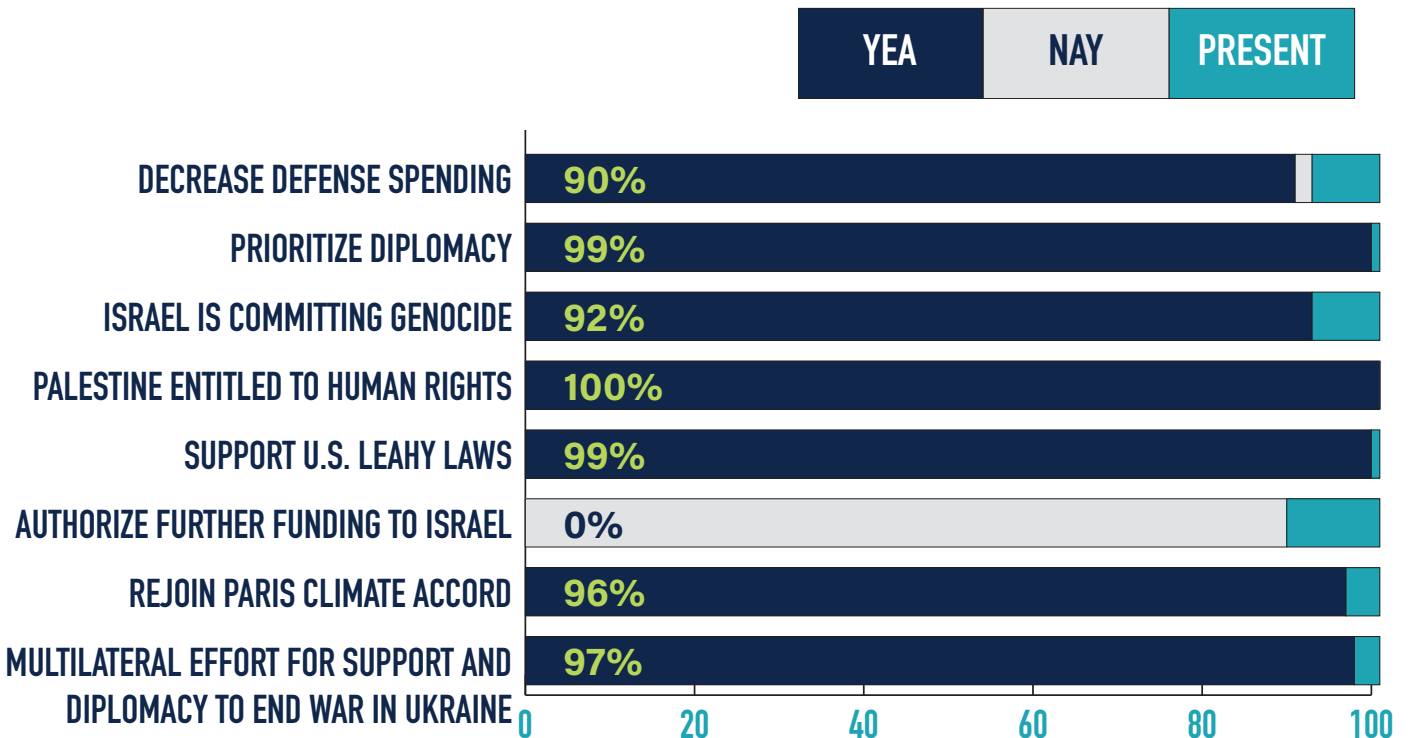


Courage Candidate Statements

GUN VIOLENCE



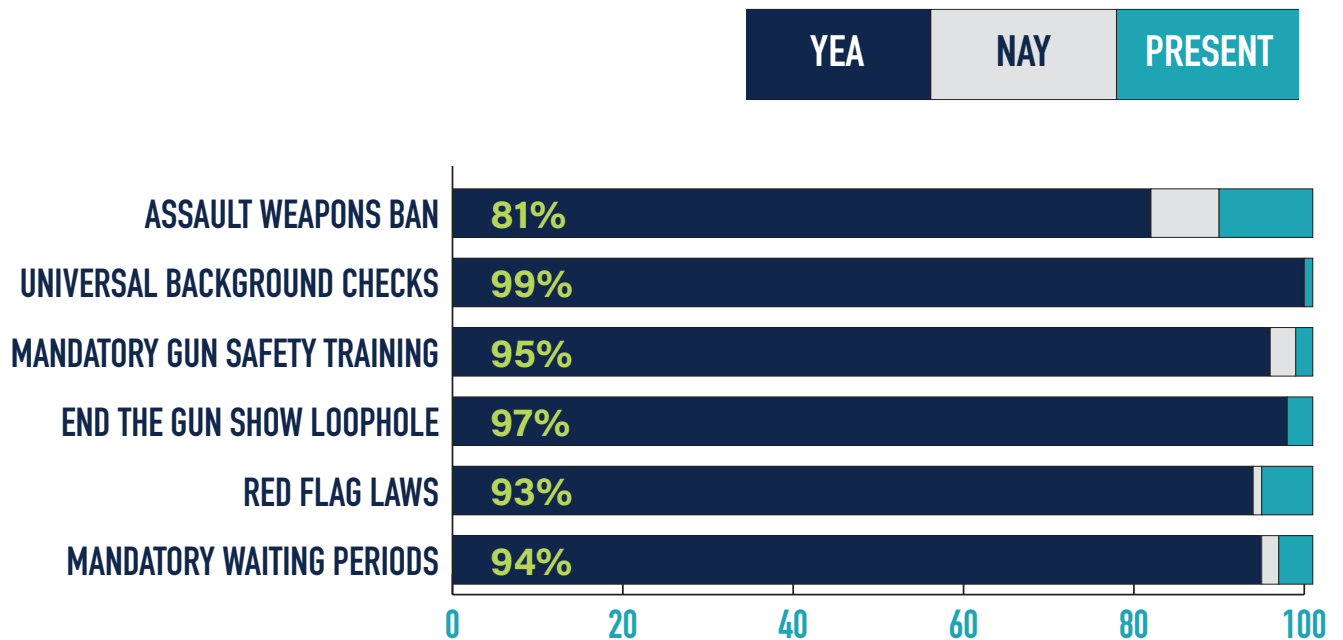

“We need to have an honest conversation on what actually mitigates gun violence and then work to achieve that mitigation.” –Wisconsin



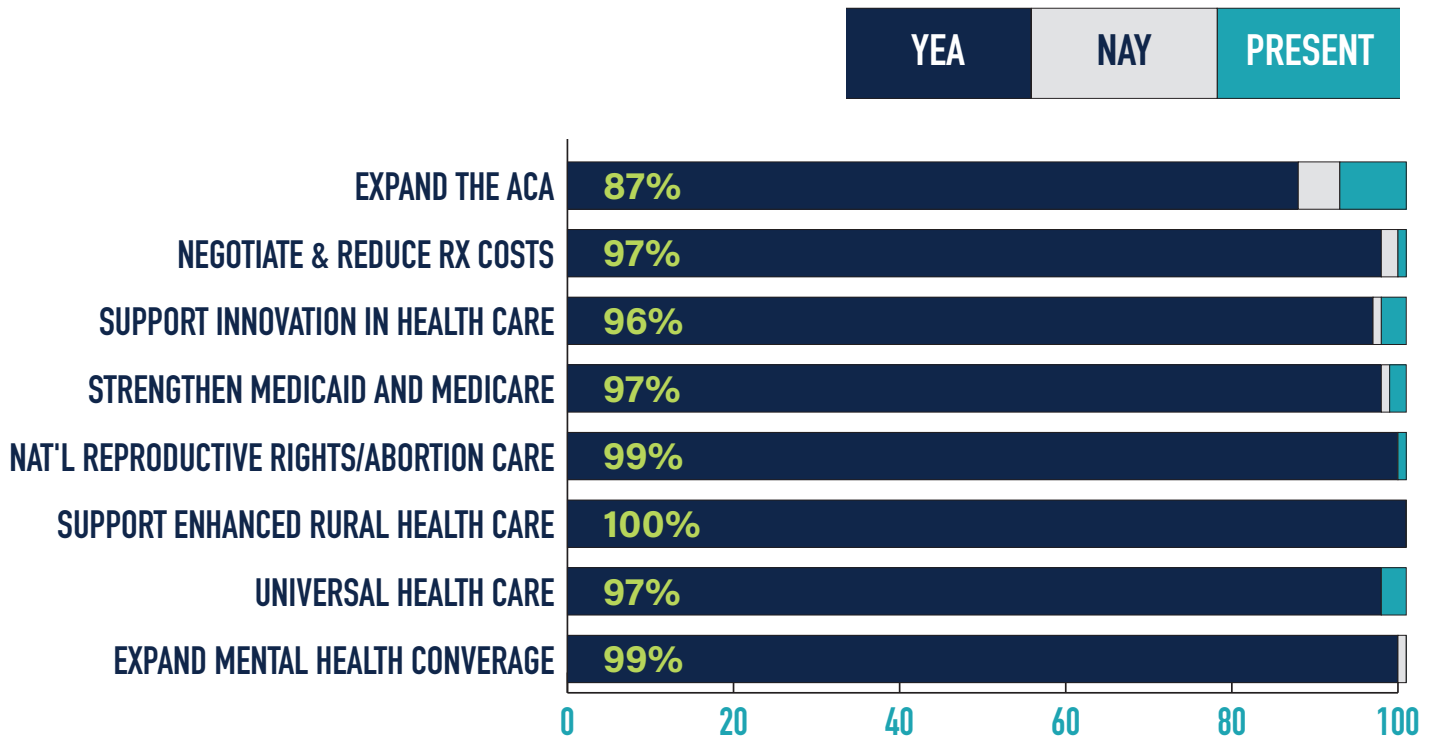
Courage Candidate Statements

HOUSING

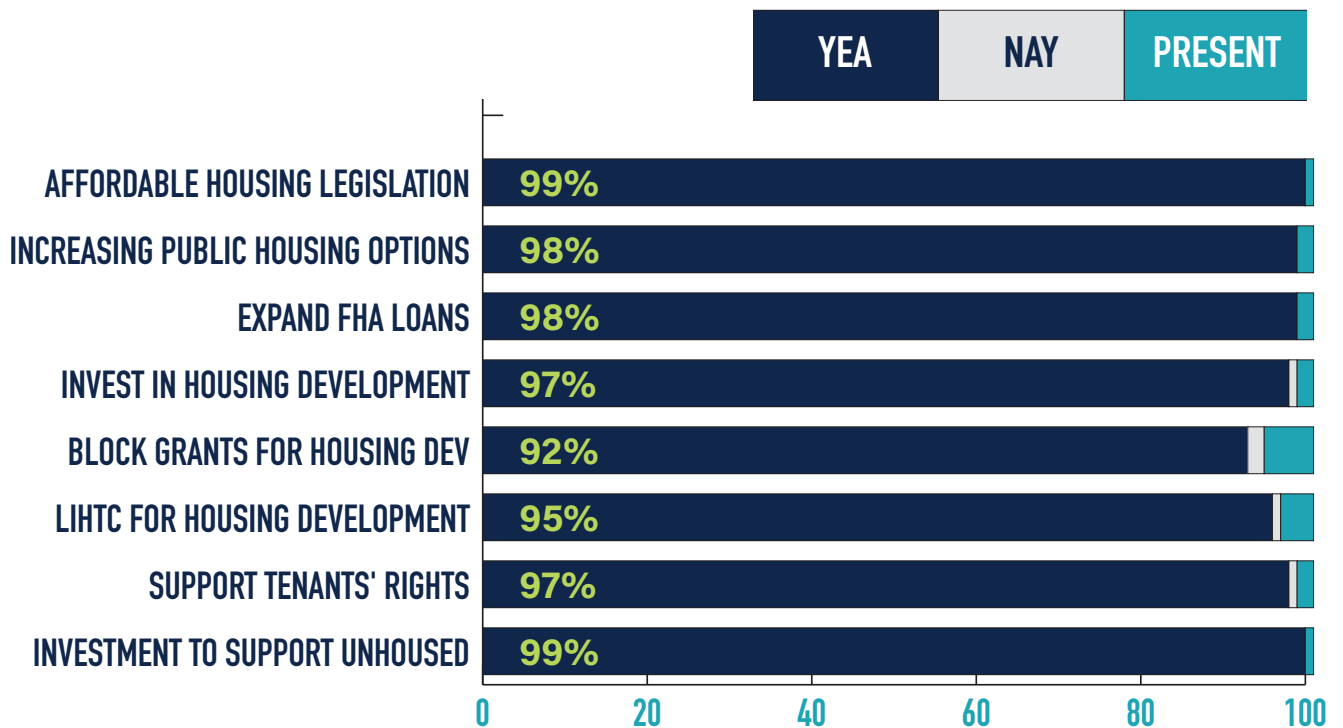


Courage Candidate Statements

IMMIGRATION



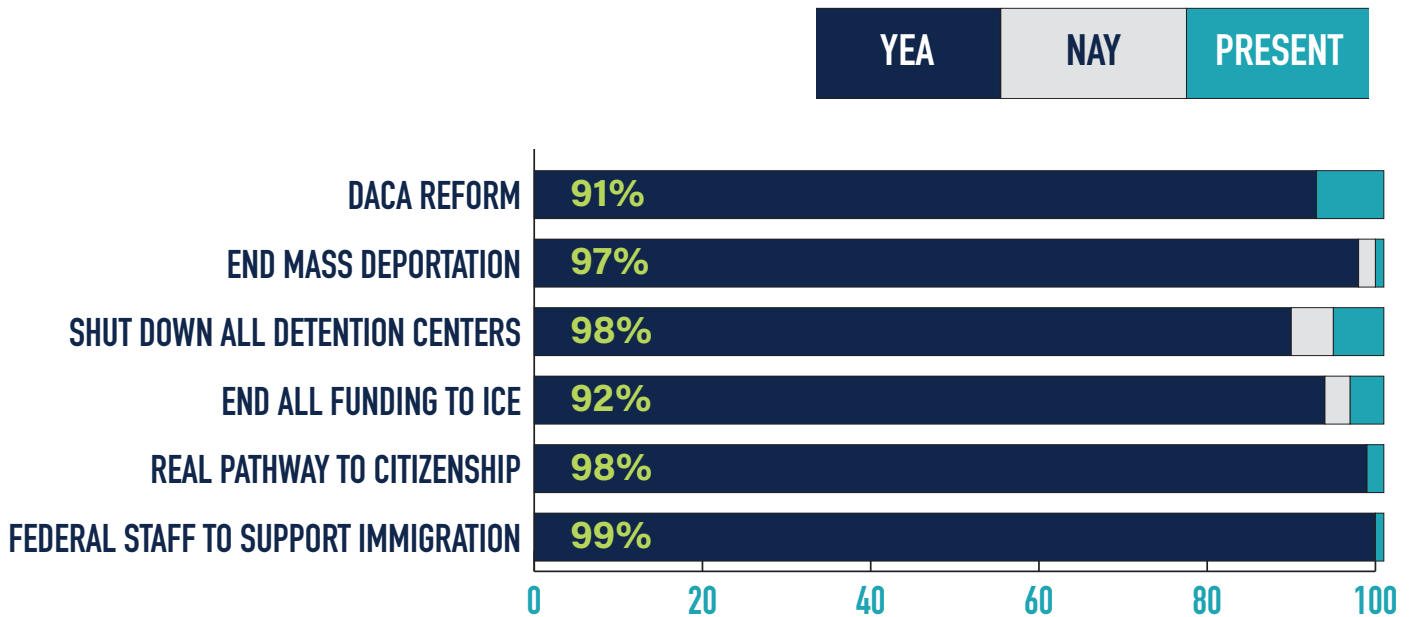
Courage Candidate Statements

SOCIAL ISSUES

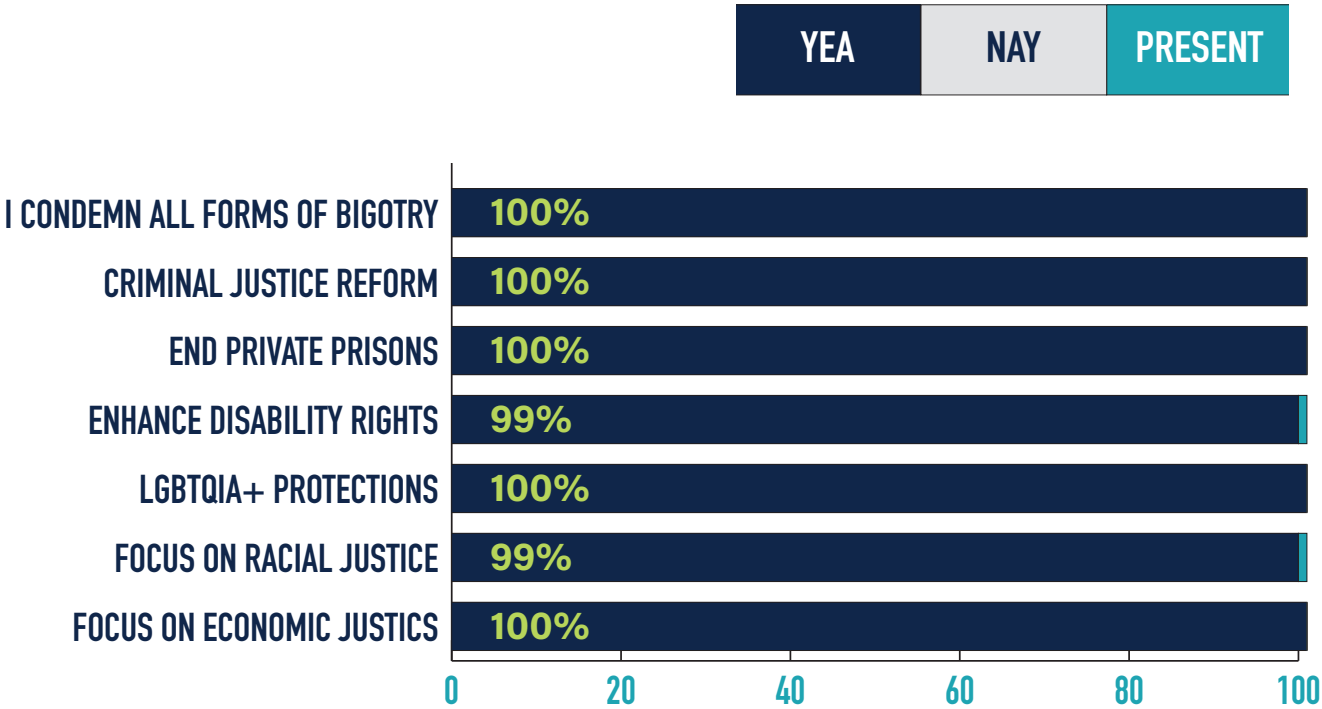


Courage Candidate Statements

TAX REFORM

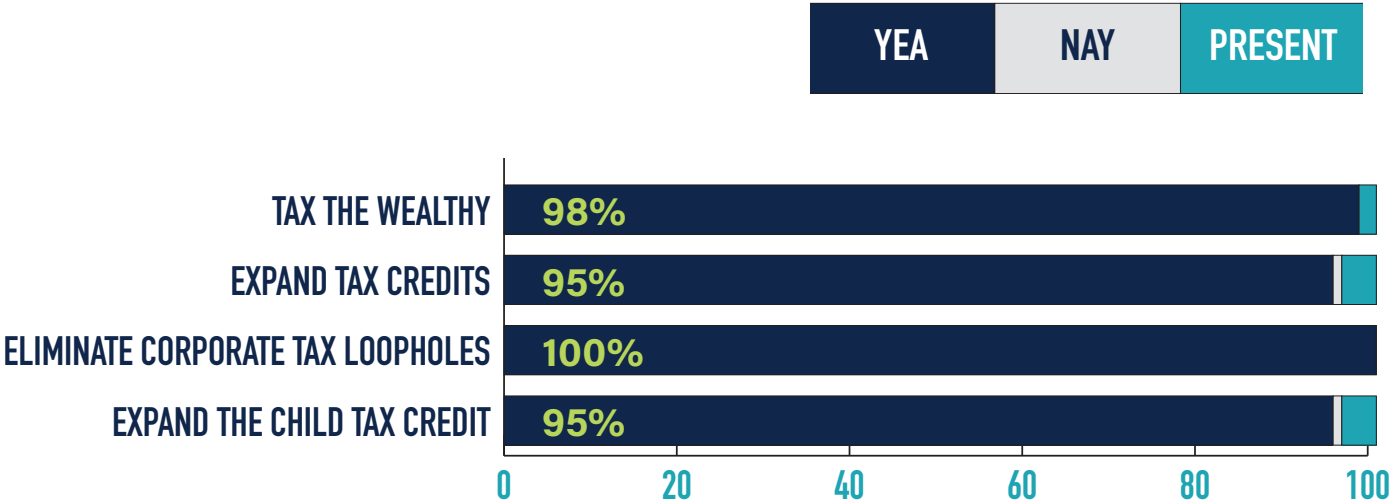
